



## 2<sup>ND</sup> ANNUAL MEDICAL CAMP REPORT- 22<sup>ND</sup> & 23<sup>RD</sup> NOVEMBER 2019

Anne K. Taylor Fund in Partnership with Angama Foundation organized a 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual free medical camp on 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2019 at Emurutoto Health Centre,



TransmaraWest –Narok County as part of the Organisations efforts of giving back to the society and providing ease access to quality medical care in the community. The two days' medical camp started at 7.00am and ended at 6.00pm daily.

The medical personnel in attendance included 1 Doctor, 7 Nurses, 5 Clinical Officers, 2 pharmacists, 2 laboratory technologists, 2 Nutritionists 1 Ophthalmologist and 1Public Health Officer. This was a great number to cater for the needs of over 400 patients including 22 under Five children who came for treatment for various ailments. In total 404 patients were attended with various needs and effectively treated and served.

They Medical team led by Dr. Eva Njenga Mubea offered medical attention to the patients which included: Providing both preventive and curative treatment for conditions present in the community, referring those who required specialized treatment to the relevant Health facilities, creating awareness and provide counselling on HIV/AIDS, Diabetes, breast cancer and other ailments.

The team was well received by our host, Emurutoto Health Centre. Various rooms were set ready to offer services. Services offered included; vital signs, triage, consultation, nutritional advice, blood sugar monitoring, Eyecheck-ups, and pharmacy-dispensing of drugs, NHIF registration/awareness







The most common presented complains were;

- Upper respiratory tract conditions; Rhinitis, asthma, Common cold
- Lower respiratory tract infections; pneumonia, bronchitis
- Diabetes Mellitus
- Hypertension
- Cancer
- Eye infections
- Gastro intestinal conditions: Heart burns, gastritis, peptic ulcer disease, H-Pylori diarrheal, abdominal pains
- Bacterial skin rashes, skin allergies
- Fungal skin infections, ringworms
- Joint pains
- Wounds
- Vaginal Candidiasis

The success of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Medical Camp would not have been realized without dedicated efforts and support of partners including Olonana Sanctuary for ensuring the Medical team and volunteers were provided with a lunch meal, & Beyond Kichwa - Tembo for hosting the County and Sub-County team providing accommodation and meals for the team, Cosmos Pharmaceuticals, Narok County Beyond Zero Mobile Clinic, Transmara West Sub-County Hospital, NCD Alliance Kenya, and other Pharmaceutical companies that aided Dr. Ev Njenga with drug supplies.





Speaking during the day 1 of the medical camp, the Narok County First Lady Sarah Tunai who graced us with presence relayed, quality healthcare is a necessity to all human beings and most people are unable to access in Maasai Community. For this reason, she found it a privilege and huge milestone for the community to have one next to our them as a way of bringing services closer to them.



The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Medical Camp left a significant impact in terms of providing better healthcare to the marginalized section of the community served, especially children and women in the communities.





Although the exercise was greatly successful, there were a few shortcomings experienced. Some of these were however overcome. These were:

- Lack of functioning Laboratory at the facility
- Lack of electricity at the facility which has been addressed
- Poor weather condition that hindered the accessibility of the community to access the services

### Way forward

- The need to continue having a collaborative approach with more partners and Specialists in dealing with health issues in the Community
- The need of having screening services in place such as Cervical cancer screening, Breast cancer screening and Prostate Cancer Screening
- Replicating success in future medical camps
- Tracking of referral cases
- Utilization of local health facilities within the community to follow up on the care of Diabetes/HTN cases and other chronic diagnosed cases.
- Update on the next Medical camp by Angama Foundation
